




Opinions needed!

President's Report - by Tom Peffer

Happy Spring 2023!

Before we all turn our attention to the exciting trail developments that will occur this year, I want to take a quick look back at the amazing year of 2022. The Linn County Trails Association, the City of Cedar Rapids, the City of Marion, the Linn County Conservation Department, and the Linn Area Mountain Biking Association all made great strides in expanding the recreational trails system in Linn County.

In 2022, the Linn County Trails Association's Board of Directors completed our largest fundraising campaign ever! With your help, \$300,000 was raised during calendar years 2021 and 2022. As an indication of the broad support for recreational trails, 540 individuals and 33 businesses contributed to the campaign. Special thanks go to the Hall Perrine Foundation. Its \$50,000 grant was instrumental to our success. Although 82% of donations to LCTA come from individuals, it is very hard to raise \$300,000 without a few larger donations from foundations or corporations. The donation from the Hall Perrine Foundation got us off and running. Also important to our success were contributions from the Linn County Fund of the Greater Cedar Rapids Community Foundation (\$10,000) and the McGrath Automotive Group Corporate Donor-Advised Fund of the Greater Cedar Rapids Community Foundation (\$2,500). Also important was the \$5,000 matching contribution from our partner, the Hawkeye Bicycle Association, as well as \$5,000 contributions from United Fire Group in both campaign years! Thanks to EVERYONE who helped us "Make Trails Happen"!

The \$300,000 was raised to support three trail projects. \$100,000 was contributed to the Linn County Conservation Department to further the easterly expansion of the Grant Wood Trail. \$100,000 was contributed to the City of Cedar Rapids to advance the design work for the 4th Street Trail that will connect the Alliant LightLine Bridge and the renovated Cedar Lake. \$100,000 was contributed to the City of Marion for the design work for the Lucore Road Pedestrian Bridge and Side Path Project, to safely separate vehicular and pedestrian/bicycle traffic. LCTA will continue to report on how all those projects are progressing.

More hard surfaced trails were constructed in 2022 than in any other year in Linn County history! Over 16 miles of hard sur-



faced trails have been added to the Linn County trails network IN THE LAST 2 YEARS alone!! Expansion like that does not happen without a lot of good work by a lot of good people, including contributors to the Linn County Trails Association.

In 2022, the City of Cedar Rapids added 3.2 miles of hard surfaced trails, and 4.0 miles of on-street bicycle facilities. Highlighting that effort was the expansion of the Grant Wood Trail from C Avenue SE to Council Street SE, including a tunnel under Blairs Ferry Road, and an expansion of the Cherokee Trail.

In 2022, Marion added 5.5 miles of hard surfaced trails. Highlights include the expansion of the Grant Wood Trail from Lindale Drive to Sixth Avenue, including the addition of two beautiful bridges over Indian Creek and Marion Blvd, construction of the Indian Creek Trail from Donnelly Park to Tower Terrace Road, and completion of the 10th Avenue side paths.


In 2022, the Linn County Conservation Department added 2.8 miles of hard surfaced trails. Additions to the Grant Wood Trail east of Waldo's Rock Park, the Highway 100 Trail and the Cedar Valley Trail north of Center Point highlight those efforts.

In 2022, the Linn Area Mountain Biking Association completed two additional miles of single-track trail along the Sac and Fox Trail.

All in all, quite a year! I look forward to talking about what is happening in 2023 in later President's articles. 2022 will be hard to beat, but with continued support from our elected representatives, the staff of our trail partners and contributors to LCTA, the future looks bright.








Mike Wilson


When Mike Wilson, former vice president of operations for Collins Radio, agreed to serve as president of LCTA in the 1990's, there was widespread opposition to trails. It gives him great satisfaction that the opposition has been transformed into widespread support and enjoyment. Because he understood the importance in documenting trail use, Mike encouraged efforts by John Wauer and fellow engineers to invent a trail counter. They succeeded in finding a way to convert the shadow of a passing user into a countable pulse. Their counters remain on Linn County trails to this day.

Mike has fond memories of walking with his wife, Esther, on the nearby Sac and Fox Trail. "The trail is rustic and fun to walk and the scenery constantly changes especially with the seasons." He continues to give financial support to the LCTA because "trails are a real asset to communities," for recreation and health. Employers find them to be helpful in hiring and retaining employees. "Personally, I have experienced these advantages."

If you've spent any time on the trails, you've encountered Clarence Boesenberg somewhere along the way. Having turned 97 in February, he continues to amaze and inspire, logging over 110,000 miles on his bike just since installing his odometer in 1999. He's also completed nine RAGBRAI's since turning 85. Still going strong, his favorite routes are "to Urbana and Solon." His favorite destination? "Ely! To Dan & Debbie's Creamery."

Clarence tells us, "I've spent many good days on the trails. Most any day I ride is a good day! A lot of people recognize and holler at me. I just feel bad that I don't recognize and know all of them."

When asked to what he attributes his hardiness, he replies, "Good genes and lots of riding. Biking has really helped me keep my health. I started riding 25 years ago when I was having trouble with my knees while walking and running. I found that riding didn't bother my knees."

He contributes generously to LCTA, saying, "Somebody before me made the trails that I enjoy. I just want to pay it forward!" Likewise, Salvation Army, Horizons, Linn County Food Bank, HACAP, Red Cross, American Cancer Society, and Church are benefactors of his generosity. He delivers for Meals on Wheels as well, saying, "They provided so much help to get my wife and I through her serious health issue; I just want to pay it back."

Getting children out in nature and biking on the trails can be an amazing experience. As all parents (and Grandparents) know, pre-planning makes all the difference! Packing plenty of water and snacks, stopping often to enjoy the scenery and maybe even bringing a best friend or two can add to the enjoyment.

According to Rascal Rides, there are seven safety tips to make a super fun and successful ride! https://rascalrides.com/7-safety-tips-for-biking-with-kids/

- 1. Ride on bike paths (or protected bike lanes).
- 2. Everyone in the group wears a helmet.
- 3. Follow the laws and be predictable. Teach children to stay in their lane.
- 4. Mount lights on your bikes. It can get dark quickly and best to be prepared.
- 5. Carry a basic safety/fix kit with you.
- 6. Keep your child close. Until age 10, children have a hard time judging speed. On trails this is a bit easier but at crossings, they need to wait for you. Bring enough adults to keep speed groups together.
- 7. Make sure your child's bike is in good working condition.
