Be Cool, it's a Bike Path – some thoughts as more multi-use trails are used by bicyclist to avoid heavily traveled roads

- 1. Get out of the Time Trial Mode...it's fun to go fast but multi-use trails are not the place!
- 2. Ride right- pass left
- 3. Obey all traffic signals
- 4. Slow down and be prepared to stop when others are around (kids, pets, horses, walkers, runners)
- 5. Make some noise before passing, be sure to look around so you don't move into someone else's path
- 6. Don't stand in the path
- 7. BE NICE!
